CHOOSING A SAINT NAME FOR YOUR CONFIRMATION

When choosing your saint name keep in mind the following:

- You may choose to keep your baptismal name because of the strong connection between Baptism and Confirmation.
- You may also choose a different name to signify a new and deeper awareness of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus.
- If the choice is made to add a new name, it must be a Christian name (a saint) whom you can **admire** and **imitate**.

Ask yourself the following when choosing a new name:

- How has this saint lived an example of a good Christian life?
- What qualities do I have that are similar to this saint? What qualities do I see in this saint that can inspire me to be a better Christian?
- Is there a special talent I have in common with this saint? Is it a patron saint for a particular profession or hobby I am interested in?

Remember this reflection **should** be used in your saint report!

STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS FOR SAINT REPORT

1. The saint report must have 5 or more paragraphs.
2. The saint report should be one page, single-spaced, in a font no larger than Ariel 12. An image is **not** part of that one page.
3. The Saint Report should be written in the student's own words and style. Do not copy the data word for word from your sources.
4. The Saint Report should begin with 2 - 3 specific paragraphs about the history and life of the student's chosen saint. The 2 – 3 paragraphs about the history of the saint must contain many specific details, including dates and names. There should be specific information about the saint's family, youth, writings, influences, accomplishments, miracles, difficulties, successes, health and death.
5. The next paragraph should specifically explain how your saint is an example of a good Christian. This paragraph must contain a story with a specific example of the saint's behavior or a miracle associated with them.
6. The next paragraph should describe the qualities the student has in common or wishes they had in common with their chosen saint. This paragraph must contain many or all of the things this saint is the patron of.
7. The final paragraph should tell why you chose this saint for your Confirmation name. This paragraph tells in detail what you most admire about your chosen saint.
